Curricular Aspects

The College ensures effective curriculum delivery through a systematic and planned process. Seminars, Industrial Visits, Projects, Industry Interactions, Internships, and Technical sessions are given for experiential as well as participative learning. Bridge courses are organized for the first year students. Academic Calendar

Subject Allocation

Time-Table

The College constitutes Time-Table co-ordinator for each department. Based on the credits assigned to the disciplines in the Andra University prescribed syllabus for associated colleges, they create the departmental timetable. In addition to being posted on each department's notice board, this schedule is distributed to the teachers and students.

Lesson Plan & Syllabus Coverages

Every faculty member creates a lesson plan at the start of each semester with the aid of the academic calendar and schedule. It also contains the assignment schedule and suggested date for each topic on the curriculum. The curriculum for laboratory sessions is a basis for the lab manuals that faculty members also compose.

Learning Material

Each faculty provides study materials, notes and question banks in the class. Additionally, they increase

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Aditya Degree College, Gopalpatnam has framed Excamination cell under the supervisoin of Principal of college, Exam cell have Coordinator & Members from each Department. Exam cell has to conduct all the Internal & External Examinations, and any Exam related grievences received from students its has being redressed through exam cell.

The academic calendar is prepared for every semester in line with the University calendar, which provides the information on scheduled timetables for internal assessments, model examinations and the tentative schedule of University practical and theory examinations. The Institution strictly follows the evaluation procedure prescribed by the affiliating University. The Institute circulates the university circulars/notifications, the evaluation process and all the academic related documents published in the university.

Internal Assessment:

Internal and a Prefinal examination are conducted during each semester. Students receive an Academic Calendar at the start of the academic year that includes the date(s) of their internal and preliminary exams. Assignments and Seminars are given to assess the skill of individual student and are considered for the award of internal marks. Within a week of the exam's conclusion, the course teacher provides the internal marks after receiving the student's signed response scripts. Students can contact the student grievance cell if they have complaints regarding their internal mark. The Student Grievance Cell steps in right away and, in conjunction with the relevant course instructor, resolves student concerns within two days of the date of application., Head of the Department, and the Principal. In our institution OBE has been implemented. Along with the tools mentioned above, every teacher must use an OBE tool for

evaluating the students' level of understanding. If any student could not attend the Internal examination on genuine reasons, retest is conducted as a student support mechanism. **Remedial Classes** are conducted for slow learners to improve their performance in the End internal mark for each course is prepared by the concerned course teacher as per the Andra University regulations duly verified by Head of the Department and is circulated among the students before submitting to the University.

End Semester Examinations are conducted by Andra University. The University sends the qualified candidates' hall passes to the College, where they are picked from by the department head. If there are any errors on the hall pass, the university is notified via the examination cell, and the problem is remedied. End Semester Examination timetable is circulated among the students and displayed in the notice board. Rules pertaining to the conduct of Examination is informed to students and followed strictly. The answer scripts are evaluated by the examiners appointed by the University and the results are published in the University website. The softcopy of the results is sent to the College. The University gives provision for the students to apply through the College for Revaluation, Retotalling and obtaining Xerox copies of the valued answer scripts through the exam cell.

Andra University has implemented **Outcome Based Education** (OBE). The Board of Studies (in the University) of all departments have framed the syllabus in which every Programme states the

- Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs),
- Programme Specific Objectives (PSOs),
- Programme Outcomes (POs),
- Curriculum,
- Course Objective and Expected Course Outcome (COs) for each course.
- Mapping between COs and POs

Communication to Teachers and Students:

The Vision, Mission, POs, PSOs, PEOs are displayed in the college website, main corridors, laboratories, classrooms, auditorium and other important areas of the campus. Also, it is printed in the observation, record notebooks and newsletters of the departments. The HOD and faculty members host awareness programmes about COs, POs, PSOs and PEOs among the students in the class committee meetings. Staff advisors of each class also explain about the COs, POs, PSOs and PEOs to the students and about attaining the program outcome.

At the start of each semester, the department head checks the University website for any changes to the curriculum and syllabus. Teachers are assigned courses according to their areas of specialization and interest. The department head gives them an orientation regarding the course outcomes and the program outcome. Teachers are oriented about outcome-based education, Bloom's taxonomy, and evaluation rubrics through Faculty Development Programs and Workshops. Lesson plans are created well in advance, and the department head oversees them. Teachers distribute the syllabus and the course objectives to the students at the start of the course. The Principal meets with the department heads on a frequent basis to ensure that the curriculum is being delivered effectively.

The College uses a blended learning approach that combines online learning, industry-based field trips and experiential learning, student-cantered classroom instruction, and integrated skill development in Soft Skills, Technical Skills, and Professional Skills to achieve the goals of the programs and courses.

The student-centred teaching learning methods adopted in the classroom involve participative, collaborative and contribute learning processes. The soft skills including communications, quantitative aptitude and personality development and capacity building are enriched through special training by specialists among students.

Students' skills are induced through the use of outcome-based education. Students' quest for information, presentation, communication, and technical skills are developed through assignments and seminars in each course. It also boosts their self-assurance. Course teachers consult with the Head of Department to choose which assessment tool will be utilized for a given course. A few of the OBE assessment instruments include the following: role-playing, debate, poster creation, paper presentations, brainstorming, group discussions, case studies, quizzes, and model preparation. This aids in evaluating and improving the pupils' abilities. The end-of-semester exam is used to assess students' knowledge and comprehension and make sure that all program and course objectives have been reached.

Attainment of POs and COs are evaluated.

The Course outcomes are the statements that describe what the students are expected to know and be able to do at the completion of the course. After specifying the course outcome, the course contents are delivered in such a way that the students can achieve the course outcome efficiently and effectively. The course outcomes (COs) are also mapped properly with programme outcomes (POs) and programme specific outcomes (PSOs) and added along with the Syllabus of the Course. The CO-PO matrix helps to evaluate the course outcomes in all programmes.

Direct and indirect evaluation methods are followed to check the fulfilment of the course outcomes. In the direct methods, initially assignments and seminars are given in each course to evaluate whether the student can assimilate the subject matter on their own. The different learner-centric pedagogies based on the Bloom's Taxonomy are used to evaluate the convergent and divergent thinking and understanding level of the students in the content of the courses during lecture hours in the classrooms. Tests are conducted for each unit of the course to evaluate the understanding level and knowledge enhancement.

The internal and external examinations are conducted incorporating different levels of University standard in the Question paper. The answer scripts are rigorously evaluated without any bias and prejudice. The communication skills, creativity, and problem-solving skills are also assessed by the case studies, research project and project presentations.

The course outcomes are also assessed indirectly by getting the feedback from the stakeholders, more specifically from the students, parents, and industrialists, in terms of different surveys for qualitative assessment. In the above evaluations, the Departments and College evaluate the students' knowledge, skills and behaviour developed through the courses taught in the programmes. By doing so, the attainment of the programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated.

Additionally, users have access to e-learning resources such as NPTEL lectures and SWAYAM courses.

Subscription to E-resources

For the use of the students, the digital library offers computers with internet connectivity at a speed of 350 Mbps. The library has active Delnet & N-List subscriptions, giving users access to e-journals and eBooks on a variety of topics. For pupils who are blind, the library has Braille blaster software installed.

Faculty and Students Usage:

There are a lot of faculty members and students are utilizing library as well as digital library. On working days, the library is accessible to Faculty members and students. A record of library visitors is kept by online gate entry. The students go to the library to exchange books, utilize the reading room, and consult the projects that are already there to finish the project work that is required for the successful completion of course. The majority of the staff and students use the remote e-resources service that the college library offers. Daily newspapers in Hindi and English are available in the reading area. On average, more than 20% of academic members and students use the library's resources.
